### Reserve a Pavilion

Pavilions can be reserved for a specific date and time, at NO CHARGE, by any person in our community. St. Matthews's residency is not required. Anyone interested in reserving a pavilion must visit the city administrative office during regular business hours, to complete a reservation form and provide photo identification.

### Reserve a Ball Field

Any individual or organized team may reserve the use of a Warwick Park ball field, pending date availability, by contacting the St. Matthews Babe Ruth Baseball & Softball office.

The small T-ball field, located in Community Park near the children's playground, is open daily to the public on a first-come, first-serve basis, except during scheduled league play.

Batting cages located in Community Park are open daily for public use from Spring through Fall of each year. Closed November until Spring.



Amenities in Brown Park include a pavilion and open areas for personal enjoyment, along with grills and picnic area spaces about the park. A children’s play structure is on site for ages 2-6 years old, along with water fountains and handicap accessible port-a-pot restrooms. Free Parking on site from Kresge Way.

Brown Park has many distinctive features, from other St. Matthews parks, such as several asphalt walking trails which meander through wooded areas along the bends and over historic Beargrass Creek. One path leads to the original family cemetery of the James Graham Brown family, who donated the land to the City of St. Matthews in 1977. The east side of the park, bordered by Browns Lane, has become home to several species of wild ducks, including Canadian geese. Other types of wildlife can be observed at times throughout the park. During the spring months many different flowering plants can be enjoyed.

Amenities in Warwick Park include a large pavilion, treed picnic areas, four basketball goals, one dirt baseball diamond along with one sand baseball field, each with a separate backstop. An asphalt walking track around the perimeter of the park, making 2.3 laps equal to one mile, is appealing to both athlete and casual walkers. The up-to-date play area recommended for ages 4-12 years, features a rock climbing section, and the surrounding adult swings and bench seating are a welcome respite. The center of the park is an open space suitable for flying kites, tossing discs, volleyball, or playing group sports such as soccer. Grills, water fountains and handicap accessible port-a-pot restrooms are on site. Free parking areas available at the park entrances of Columbia, Kentucky and Washburn Avenues.

Amenities in Community Park include basketball and tennis courts, a children’s play area with equipment recommend for ages 4-12 years of age, a pavilion, picnic tables, grills, water fountains and handicap accessible port-a-pot restrooms.

In the northeast corner of the park is a sizable wooded area with asphalt walking path and inviting bench and swing seating. The presence of a natural stream running along the rear portion of the park, spanned by wooden

foot bridges, makes this a great place to take a relaxing stroll or just commune with nature.

Designed as a sports park, many ball fields are throughout. These fields are managed and utilized exclusively for the St. Matthews Babe Ruth Baseball & Softball League. However, the T-ball field, near the children’s play area, and the batting cages are open daily for public use from Spring through Fall each year, except during scheduled league play.
