

ANNUAL LEAF COLLECTION SCHEDULED

The crisp, cool days of autumn are filled with festivals, holidays and leaves. As the leaves turn from the summer green to the colorful red, orange and yellow of fall, they also begin to cover our lawns and we're faced with raking them up.

We would like to remind the citizens of St. Matthews that our annual leaf collection will begin on Monday, November 4. We ask that you rake your leaves into bunches, not one continuous mass, and pile them along your curb.

There will be two scheduled pickups of leaves. The schedule of the first pickup will be posted on trees and light poles in your neighborhood telling you the week you can expect

pickup. A specific day can not be posted. Once the entire city has had one pickup, the entire process will be done again. No advance notice will be given for the second pickup.

The first pickups will begin the week of November 4. Watch your neighborhood for posted signs beginning the last week of October.

Wants You To Know...

In cooperation with the City of Lyndon, the City of St. Matthews is sponsor a Radon Awareness Program. Beginning November 1, citizens of St. Matthews can purchase for \$2 a kit to test your residence for safety.

These kits which normally cost \$3.50 (the city is absorbing the rest of the expense) are self-explanatory. You merely take the kit home, open and place in your basement for 48 hours. At the end of that time period, close the kit and mail it to the state office. The results, which are strictly confidential, will be returned to you.

This same test done by a commercial firm costs approximately \$50. The City of St. Matthews has ordered 500 kits and more will be ordered if demand exceeds the supply.

You can pick your Radon Awareness Kit up at City Hall beginning November 1 for \$2 with proof of St. Matthews' citizenship (driver's license, etc.)

Trash Pickup-Please remember, no one wants your trash scattered throughout the neighborhood. Do not set your trash out any earlier than the night before your scheduled pickup. Your consideration will be appreciated by your community.

Our re-cycling program is continuing to grow and we are pleased with the results. We might remind you that in order for this to be the success we hope, everyone needs to become involved with it. Everytime you re-cycle, you are helping the city, the state and the future.

UPDATE ON FUTURE FEDERAL BUILDING

Citizen's Fidelity has purchased most of the assets and are currently renting the facility from the City of St. Matthews. Their departure is anticipated in February, 1992 at which time our planned changes will begin.

The architect is currently working on plans for remodeling the building and we will keep you posted as they develop. A calendar date for the move of City Hall has not be established at this point.

The City Council has decided that the Works Department will not be moved to this Grandview location.

It has also been decided that the District Count will no longer be hosted by the City at either our present location or the new site.

As renovation plans become more finalized, we'll keep you informed.

CITY AIDS ELEMETARY SCHOOL BUDGET

The City has allocated \$2000 for each of four elementary schools for use in the school library. The four locations are Walden School, Holy Trinity School, Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Matthews Elementary School.

JUST AS A REMINDER...

Street Light Program--If you'd like to have a street light added in your neighborhood and if 51% of your neighbors agree, submit a signed petition to City Hall. You may select the style--either an Acorn style or a Coachlight style--but the exact placement will be chosen by an LG&E engineer.
